### Motivations

Known to friends as 'Bill', MCINTYRE is generally well-liked and trusted. He feels a great sense of comradeship with fellow soldiers and will go to great lengths to support the Army.

This conflict of loyalty to the SSG is further complicated by the fact that MCINTYRE had been supplying the Soviets with intelligence information. Mostly low-level, he now has access to more important secrets but has lost contact with his handlers. He is desperately seeking to restore contact with the Soviets. MCINTYRE believes that the Soviet system is morally superior to that of the West and his disillusionment with warfare strengthened his resolve to work for the USSR.

### Known History

Since leaving school, MCINTYRE served in the 1st East Anglian Regiment before being seconded to SSG and was stationed in West Germany and (briefly) British Guiana. He was promoted to Sergeant and returned to London shortly before the war where he made contact with a Soviet agent and began supplying him with intelligence.

No family known to have survived the war. Most of his former Army comrades were stationed in British Guiana and their situation is unknown.
